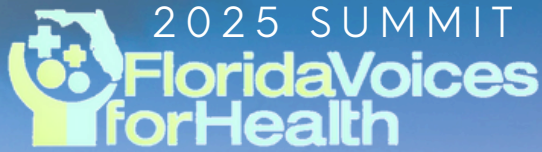

Unpacking how federalism transforms Medicaid beneficiaries' interpretations of government and structures their participation in politics, "Fragmented Democracy" assesses American political life from the vantage point(s) of those who are living in or near poverty.

3:00 pm – 4:00 pm | Rural Realities: Overcoming Barriers to Health Care Access in Florida's Underserved Communities

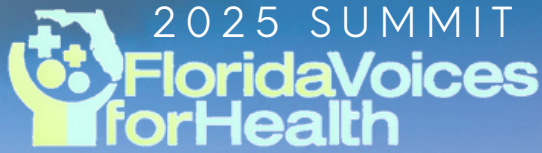

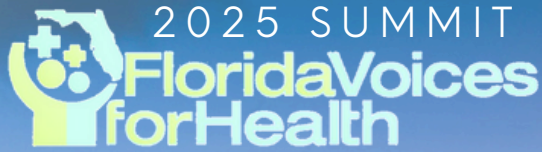
10:05 am – 11:45 am | Attorney Office Hours: Lobbying Limits 101 and the Power of Legal Advocacy
